## NEW HANOVER COUNTY GOP CONVENTION by Patti Smithson

The New Hanover County Republican Party held its annual convention Saturday, March 20, 2021 at the Seaside Chapel in Carolina Beach. There were 109 in-person delegates and 16 Zoom attendees. NC GOP Chairman Michael Whatley – in a whirlwind tour of the Eastern part of the state – made a stop at the convention to bring greetings from HQs! Chairman Whatley congratulated NHC on their election efforts. Although President Trump did not carry New Hanover, he got 66,000 votes which exceeded the number of votes needed out of New Hanover for Trump to carry

All delegates to the NHC GOP convention were elected as delegates to the 7<sup>th</sup> District Convention (which was held on April 10<sup>th</sup>) and to the NC GOP Convention to be held in Greenville June 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup>. Chairman Michael Whatley will be a candidate for re-election as state party chair. Chairman Whatley has the support of the members of the LCFRWC, and is scheduled to be our August guest speaker.
